

BUS UPDATE

Cllr David Harris is delighted to announce that, at a meeting he has recently had with First Bus, he was told that the no.3 bus will definitely be in the schedule starting in May. They are also experimenting with an additional bus in this service leaving town at 5.00pm to bring people home at the end of the afternoon. There has been a slight change in other times. Again, the more people who use it, the more likely the service will stay and we might even be able to add to it.

To help improve their support for customers they now have an App, (doesn't everyone

have an App?), called First Bus App, you might want to download it and open it for Wessex (Dorset and Somerset) and you can not only see all the timetables but also where the buses are at any one time. This shows you if there is a hold up.

CLIMATE CHANGE AND FLOODING



There has been significant flooding in the area recently. The climate is changing and we are likely to get more extreme weather which will mean that flooding will be more frequent. **Matt Bell** has been concerned about Radipole Lake and flooding in that area. The reserve, owned by Dorset Council, is a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) so a very important environmental site. He has spoken to the RSPB who are the leaseholders who are also concerned about siltation. **Matt** started a petition calling on experts to make urgent progress on silt removal. However, both Cllr Matt Bell and the RSPB, are now dependent on Dorset Council, as the landowners and Local Lead Flood Authority, being willing to carry out the necessary assessments and subsequent work.

The petition has prompted Dorset Council to promise a review of the current situation at the lake and an investigation into what actions have, or should have, taken place over the last decade. **Matt** is pursuing this and will keep you in the loop. A meeting of the organisations involved in the management of the lake is now scheduled for 8th Feb and a list of investigatory actions has been formulated.

ROAD SAFETY

Cllrs Pete Barrow and David Gray have been campaigning hard to improve road safety in the ward. Speeding on Radipole Lane is a major concern and is raised regularly as was the spate of recent collisions on Radipole Lane. Pete has been in contact with Dorset Council to see what they intend to do to prevent more collisions.

Pete and David have also been supporting a local campaign to get a controlled crossing installed on the Wessex Way roundabout to make it safer for pupils to walk/cycle from Southill to Budmouth School. Pete said 'So far we've had a traffic survey done, which clearly showed a controlled crossing is required. In addition we have been told that Dorset Council are now working up a design for the crossing and once agreed funding will need to be found.'

In our view it is all taking too long and we are keen that **Matt and Louise** should take this over to ensure this is progressed. We are involving them in

conversations on this issue. **Louise** said 'We have been really grateful for the work Pete and David have done. I live quite close to this junction so will certainly take the reins up and keep pressing to get a crossing installed.' David said 'As the crossing is going to take so long to install we have asked for temporary measures to be installed to improve safety in the short term.' We are really pleased to see that the Radipole Park and Gardens Project is well underway. Huge thanks to the Friends of Radipole Park and Gardens and to WTC staff for all their hard work over many years. Work has been

delayed by the severe weather, but all should be finished by the spring. The work includes a café, a new play area, refurbished tennis courts, basketball/football area, a sensory garden, a petanque terrain and outside table tennis.

As local residents will know, there has been no action on site for ages. Previous updates have let residents know that the costs for the original scheme rose dramatically due to recent inflation and exceeded the money BCHA had available. Work stopped to allow them to decide what to do next.

of Development who has developed some ideas for a new way forward. He has agreed to meet Pete, David and Louise on site to discuss the new ideas and we will let residents have an update as soon as we can.

Louise said 'We need housing; this site cannot stay like this.'

In the meantime, BCHA has stated that they will ensure the site is kept enclosed and as secure as possible. They will monitor the situation and take any additional steps necessary. As you may have seen, the height of the crushed material has been reduced and the fencing around the site has been improved. Louise will be taking over this issue to make sure residents are involved in the final decision so if you have concerns please contact her.
